Did You Know??



How to take a drop

When you are taking relief from a drain or GUR you must drop the ball properly, at the nearest point of relief - never just toss it out.

When taking relief from things like temporary water, ground under repair, cart paths, and sprinkler heads (abnormal course conditions), the reference point is the nearest point of complete relief. This is the spot on the course nearest to where your ball lies, but not nearer the hole, where you could play your next stroke with no interference from the condition you're taking relief from.

Players continue to drop a ball when taking relief, but the dropping procedure is changed in several ways as detailed in Rule 14.3:

To drop the ball, you must face the flag and then the only requirement is that the ball be let go from knee height so that it falls through the air and does not touch any part of the player's body or equipment before it hits the ground.
